HISTORICAL IRISH ITEM OF INTEREST FOR OUR MEMBERS Lieutenant Colonel Sean Clancy, 105-yearsold, War of Independence veteran who served alongside Michael Collins, died in the fall of 2006. He was a former Commanding Officer of the Fifth Infantry Battalion and fought against British forces in the Dublin Brigade of the Volunteers from 1919 to 1921. The Co Clare native also shared the historic moment in Dublin Castle in 1922 with Collins when Britain handed over power to the new Irish Government. In a statement the Defence Forces said: "It is with great regret the Defence Forces mourn the death of Lieutenant Colonel Sean Clancy at the age of 105 years." At the time of his death, in a Dublin nursing home, Lt. Col. Clancy was the oldest surviving person receiving military service pension for his role in the War of Independence." After serving in the War of Independence, Lt. Col Clancy signed up to join the National Army on May 22, 1922. He was commissioned as a lieutenant the following year and held a number of posts during the Civil War Years and in the Emergency.

Current programs by San Francisco's Cooley-Keegan Branch of CCE include weekly set dance lessons, bi-monthly adult and children's céilís, music and dance workshops, song and storytelling evenings, Irish language nights, and special events throughout the year — all of which are open to the community.

The UICC, built by volunteer labor and donations in 1974, sought as one of its primary goals to provide a facility where Irish culture would be preserved and nourished. CCE wishes to acknowledge with grateful thanks, the support the UICC has been, over the years, to our branch, as well as all the other organizations in the Irish Community.
