

Irish and Scotch-Irish Ancestral Research: A Guide to the Genealogical Records, Methods and Sources in Ireland Volumes I and II

Written by world-recognized authority on Irish genealogy, Margaret Dickson Falley, this is considered a masterpiece by genealogists and an essential tool for anyone seeking to trace an Irish family background.
