

BOOKS ON IRISH AMERICANS IN THE AMERICAN CIVIL WAR

Next year, 2011, marks the 150th anniversary of the beginning of the American Civil War. Irish-born and the sons and grandsons of Irish immigrants enlisted in both the Union and Confederate armies. The Union Army had as many as 150,000 Irish-born soldiers---nearly four times as many as the Confederate Army---because the majority of Irish immigrants landed in northern cities such as Boston and New York after the Famine. In comparison, approximately 40,000 men with Irish roots joined the Confederate Army, making them the largest immigrant group that fought for the Southern cause. A large number of these soldiers arrived in New Orleans after the Famine. Although the Yankee blockade of southern ports during the war temporarily stopped Irish immigration to the southern states, the Confederate Army had 45 distinctly Irish companies such as Alabama's Emerald Guards and Virginia's Emmet Guards. Shamrocks and Irish harps decorated Union Army recruiting posters, enticing men to join 38 Irish regiments. The Irish Brigade, the most famous Irish corps in the Union Army, totaled 7,000 at the beginning of the war; 1,000 returned to New York when the war ended in 1865. Many died at the Battle Gettysburg, July 1-3, 1863. To learn more about the role Irish Americans played in this significant chapter of American history, the library recommends the following books in its collection:

The library seeks donations of books on Irish Americans who fought in the Confederate Army.

VIDEOS IN THE LIBRARY'S COLLECTION

Edge of Europe. Story of the Early Christian monks living on Skellig Michael, Ballinskelligs Abbey and Cill Reilig, off the Kerry Coast.

The History of Ireland takes the viewer from ancient Ireland to the founding of the Republic.

Walking Into Eternity with Patrick Ryan tours the Dublin of James Joyce's Ulysses.

- *Discovering Ireland* Explore Newgrange, Glendalough, Conmacnoise, Rock of Cashel, Blarney Stone, Bunratty Castle, Walls of Derry, Aran Island, Cliffs of Moher, Glenns of Antrim, Giant's Causeway, Ring of Kerry, and the Lakes of Killarney
- *Spell of Ireland.* Visit Ireland of the 1940s: Dublin, Donegal Highlands, Cork, Belfast, and Kylmore Abbey. This video was originally produced in the 1940s and restored.
- *The Dingle Peninsula and the Slea Head Drive.* Journey into the historical and cultural past of the beautiful west Kerry, including numerous archaeological sites.
- *Journey Back to Ireland*. Ramble through the Emerald Isle, experiencing the stories behind the Books of Kells, the wild beauty of Connemara, and the magical landscapes with standing stones, monasteries and castles.
- Ireland's Emerald Treasures. See the sites of Dublin, scenic County Wicklow, Kikenny, County Kildare, and Galway Bay.

Ireland The Isle of Memories. Travel through all 32 counties.

The library recommends these videos and others on Donegal, Clare, Kerry and Galway for those planning a trip to Ireland this year. All videos can be viewed in the library.
