

"**Thomas Patrick Brady**, originally from Seattle, WA, graduated from SI into the Jesuit seminary which he left, then graduated USF law school. He retired from the San Francisco Tax Assessment Appeals Board. YLI, a Catholic fraternal organization, was his main social focus. He was a great singer and leader of singers especially around St. Patrick's Day. Tom was the go-to guy for song lyrics going back to his father's era. He was a long term resident of the Sunset where he kept the donated books."

Michael Beere also donated an eclectic collection of books, albums and cassettes of Irish music and comedy that had belonged to his mother. The books include: *San Francisco Hallinan Toughest Lawyer in Town* by James Walsh, *The GAA in its Time* by Padraig Pursell and many books about Limerick.


