If there is any type of "silver lining" to this great tragedy, it is in the Irish community in the Bay Area's response that has been overwhelmingly positive. The support in the Irish community's outreach during such a dark time has been noted by all in the Bay Area and across the country and across the Atlantic in Ireland.

PATRICK J. DOWLING LIBRARY NEWS

TREASURERS OF THE PATRICK J. DOWLING LIBRARY



The walls of the library are lined with wonderful pictures and maps, including one of Father Peter Yorke parish priest, proponent of education, and supporter of the labor movement and of Irish nationalist. Although born and raised in Galway, Fr. Yorke had a great impact on the life and times of San Francisco in the late 1800's and early 1900's. In 1901, he was an advocate for the workers during the famous Teamster's strike in San Francisco. Founder of the Leader newspaper, which chronicles the life of the Irish Catholics in San Francisco as well as the events unfolding in Ireland, he used this platform to passionately advocate for his causes. At one point

according to legend, his advocacy irritated Archbishop Riordan so much that he was "exiled" to a parish in Oakland, which turned out to be a most fortunate event as he was able to provide support to the victims of the 1906 earthquake by giving shelter to elderly patients from St. Mary's Hospital and cutting through red tape to get the supplies he needed. Finally he was forgiven by the archbishop and allowed to return to St. Peter's Parish where he served as a much beloved pastor. He died on Palm Sunday in 1925 and was buried at Holy Cross Cemetery. Each Palm Sunday the United Irish Societies and Carpenters' Local 22 celebrate his life with a mass at Holy Cross. After mass with bagpipes playing, the celebrants march up to his grave for speeches honoring him and his support of the labor movement.

The young people, who so tragically lost their lives, were remembered in speech and by a bagpipe rendition of Amazing Grace. Jo Coffey and Valerie McGrew, the organizers of the event, would like to thank all of the participants-the readers and the audience including one of the library's biggest supporters, Caitie O'Shea, and the Warrior fans from the bar who wandered in to listen during breaks from the game. It was a rather unusual Bloomsday event in that, while there were some readings from *Ulysses* by Jo Coffey, Valerie McGrew and Carol Thornton, other readers picked their favorite Irish writers to read including some of Yeats' lovely poems. It all worked wonderfully. Our own president, Judith Kell, read portions from Oscar Wilde's children's book, the *Selfish Giant*. Donagh McKweon concluded the program with an excerpt from Becket. We also had the opportunity to listen to a lovely collection of songs mentioned in *Ulysses* that Jo put together. Gorgonzola sandwiches, celebrated in Episode 8 of *Ulysses*, were served.

All our best to Chris Creighton who has moved on to new endeavors. Thank you so much for all your many years of dedication and hard work as a volunteer at the library.
