BOARD MESSAGE

Dear UICC Members,

My hope for you and your families is that you are all staying well and healthy. We, The Board, miss seeing you! Happy Mothers day to all the mothers near and far! We can all celebrate and toast from a distance.

At the Center, bringing people together and continuing to honor the immigrant's story is what we do. And when you are in the business to bring people together and are hindered from doing so there is much concern for when will "normal" return? In 2019, we started to define our new business structure: 501c3 cultural community center supporting local artists, promoting Irish culture and cross cultural programs and providing an event space on the west side of the city. In 2020 that all changed.

The UICC had to cancel all events and meetings for March, April and May. Cancelling March was a huge revenue loss to our overall budget and a loss to our Irish community as a whole. We missed out on the parade, our music, our block party, and all our best made plans. It will come as no surprise that we report a 70% decline in revenues in the first three months of 2020, compared to the first quarter of 2019.

Since the closure, the Board has met online weekly and sub-committees have met on separate other occasions-as its all hands on deck, to get through the lockdown and be prepared to hit the ground running at the other side, once restrictions are lifted. Our new treasurer Craig, prepares weekly finance reports and dives deep into all areas related to finance. Thank you Craig! Be mindful that all Board members have day jobs and the energy and ideas that they bring to our weekly meetings is incredible.

There is some positive news. Ongoing facilities costs are running 30% below what it cost to run the same 3 month period last year. Several upgrades and cost cutting measures initiated I2 months ago are now being reflected in overall reduced fixed monthly costs. Having our doors closed for the last three months, we have had to cut back further with payroll, water, heating, garbage and recycling pick ups. Board member Liam Reidy, who heads up the Facilities department and a recent team of volunteers Mike Bowler, John Cahalane and Shane O'Malley have done Trojan work to help the Center get back on its feet- by focusing on deferred maintenance in several areas of the building. Thank you to all for what you do. I greatly appreciate and applaud your help!

The proverb "Necessity is the mother of invention" is often credited with the Ancient Greek philosopher Plato. It has been used several times in Board meetings on-line and off-line these past few weeks as we try to develop creative ideas to offset the lack of operational income and recover our major loss

In addition, Comhaltas is starting to provide Irish language classes and the library is creating a virtual setting for presentations. As you can see, the UICC is being challenged financially-without consistent revenue for the last three months (and more) there is great concern about the future of the Center. 

Dear Irish Center Members,

There is still time to participate in the 2020 Census! The census is a count of EVERYONE living in the United States, including the very young and the very old, citizens and non-citizens, the housed and the unhoused. There's a lot at stake: data from the census determine how many representatives we have in Congress and has an impact on how much federal money comes into San Francisco for schools, hospitals, roads, social services and more.

We should all do the census. You can do it in about 10 minutes without leaving home! In March, most people received a letter from the Census Bureau with instructions on how to do the census online at my2020census.gov (available in 13 languages) or over the phone at 844-330-2020 (available in 15 languages). However, no letter, pin or ID number is required - anyone can and should do the census online or by phone between mid-March and October 2020. The questionnaire is just nine simple questions and does NOT ask about citizenship. Data provided is safe and secure and the U.S. Census Bureau is required by law to keep responses confidential.

Tell all of your friends and neighbors to do the census so that San Francisco gets our fair share! Learn more at sfcounts.org.

Last week San Francisco Mayor London Breed and SFMTA announced a new temporary program to assist seniors and adults with disabilities who need to make essential trips for the duration of the Stay Home Order

The ECT program will provide cost-reduced taxi trips for older adults and people with disabilities who must travel for essential needs.

California Department of Aging (CDA) has partnered with The Institute on Aging to expand the Friendship Line's ability to accept calls from older Californians from any county! The Friendship Line is the only accredited crisis line in the country for older adults, adults living with disabilities, and their caregivers.

The phone line is staffed with specialists who provide emotional support, grief support, active suicide intervention, information and referrals. 
