This month we give pride of place to all the members and families who have contributed over \$40,000 since last summer to the Leo Walsh Education Scholarship Fund. The funds will be dispersed in June to local 8th graders attending high school in the fall, and local high school seniors who are college-bound this Autumn. Applications are currently under review by the Scholarship committee. Since 1994, over 500 scholarships have helped educate young members of the local Irish American community. The UICC finances are on a solid foundation (despite the impact of the pandemic) after two years of amazing work by a dedicated and hard-working board with the support of the 1,150 active members, volunteers, and the broader community. Members should make every effort to attend the in-person public meeting on Friday, May 7th at 7 pm which outlines the plans for the future of the Irish Center. While the meeting will be conducted in the St. Patrick's room following local mandated Covid guidelines, we will also simultaneously stream it into the Wawona Gates canopy. We have spent much of the past year developing plans to make the Irish Center a destination once again. Come and hear about the exciting plans for the future of the building.

Now that Covid restrictions are shaking loose and more and more people can gather safely, our private event bookings are on the rise. Delayed and canceled meetings, birthday parties, memorials, and weddings are filling up the UICC calendar. It is great to have the "event excitement" in the building again. Longer-term,

we are happy to see some of our larger clubs and organizations secure dates for their annual events. The Connaught Club has scheduled their annual dinner for Saturday, Oct 9th, the Emerald Society is penciled in for Oct 23rd, while the Rebel Cork clubs have secured Dec IIth.

We are also happy to report that we have three different Irish dance schools currently teaching out of the Center. Welcome to the Dillon, Murphy, and Kennelly schools. Irish dance schools and the dancers themselves have had a tough time during the pandemic as classes and competitions were heavily restricted. The dance schools were the first to kick start our cultural programming last fall on our outdoor stage, and we are delighted to host classes inside now.

Our kid's Storytime classes on Saturday mornings via zoom during March and April were a big hit with kids and parents alike. Máire Clerkin from Los Angeles was the "seanachaí" (storyteller) who kept the kids on the edge of their seats and sometimes out of their seats to dance and play each Saturday. It is hoped to bring the kid's storytime back in the fall.

Our Irish Summer Camp runs from June 7th to June 25th, and interest has been robust to date, to say the least. The camp will take place at the St. Cecilia's Collins Center, at 2560 18th Avenue between Vicente and Ulloa. Early bird pricing until May 15th, \$750 for three weeks of camp from 9 am to 3 pm each day. Learn to play the drums, or keyboards, speak Irish, participate in drama, storytelling, multi-media production, art classes, and even hip hop!

The Irish Dance exhibition organizing group spearheaded by Anne Cassidy Carew is busy collecting memorabilia and documenting Irish dance stories at the moment. Thank you to all the members who have taken the time to write to me, or email me in the recent past. I do take time to respond to each and everyone one of you. I know the Irish Center is close to your heart, and I want to reassure you that the Center is in good hands. 

JOHN JOSEPH CASEY RIP

March 2nd, 1930 - April 19, 2021

John Joseph Casey was born on 03/02/30 to Catherine Cross and John Joseph Casey Sr. in Askeaton County Limerick, Ireland. John was one of six boys: Mike, Billy, Jim, Tossie and Paddy and two girls, Lily and Mary in a large Irish catholic family of eight. He had many endeavors in his life. His youngest brother Paddy always said, "He was always going somewhere." One day he did. In 1956 he left Ireland for the great USA. He left home two years after Ellis Island closed, and was bound for Australia. However upon his initial glance of San Francisco bay and reaching out of his Haight Ashbury apartment window to find an orange in hand without any effort from a tree decided to make San Francisco his new home. Where home was to John there was construction. He worked many jobs in his life: Riker's Island in NY harbor, Chicago fireman, Lawrey's construction, Cahill construction, Presco construction and construction for the City and County of S.F. John help build and repair many S.F edifices: S.F Hilton, S.F. Mint., etc. As an avid member of the UICC in its infancy John helped with many construction projects. According to his wife, "He was flying where no Irishman has gone before." upon high height repairs on the center. John Joseph was the first on his 27th ave block in S.F to build up a third level on a two level house structure. He was a master fly fisher-



man self-taught on the Shannon River in Ireland, an avid camping cowboy and dreamed of always being a sea captain. John passed away on 04/19/21 at the age of 91. He believed in duty, honor and strength. John Joseph is survived by his devoted wife, Donna and partner of 58 years, his eldest daughters, Anne Casey-Nielson, Carol Casey, and his only grandson Vincent Casey Nielson.

JARLATH THOMAS O'CONNOR RIP

November 21, 1935 - March 29, 2021



Jarlath "J.T." O'Connor died peacefully at home in Tiburon, California on March 29, 2021, of natural causes, surrounded by his devoted family.

A towering pillar of the Irish community of San Francisco for many decades, Jarlath was born into a large family in rural Milltown, County Galway, Ireland and attended St. Jarlath's College in Tuam, County Galway. He worked with, and for his brother at Tony's grocery business in Tuam, but like so many other young people of Ireland in the mid 20th Century, including his brothers Michael and James, both priests, he was drawn to immigrate to America.

Jarlath arrived in California in 1958 where he was welcomed by his brother Fr. Michael O'Connor and found a new home in San Francisco, where he met his wife Iris (Edgeworth) of Ballyconnell, County Cavan. He was drafted into the US Army, stationed briefly in Germany, and served in the San Francisco Police Department for eight years. Along with Iris, he purchased Harrington Brothers Moving and Storage in 1968 and later expanded the business to buy and sell

used furniture and antiques. They soon moved Harrington Brothers to the building at Valencia and 17th Streets that houses the family business today. He was a fixture on Valencia Street for over fifty years and helped countless young immigrants from Ireland and elsewhere to find their footing in San Francisco without ever losing their connection to the homes they had left behind.

He returned to Ireland innumerable times and instilled a great love of the country in his children and grandchildren. He worked tirelessly in support of the Irish community in San Francisco, with particular focus on the United Irish Cultural Center (where he served time as a board member in 1987), the Irish Immigration Pastoral Center, the Irish priests and nuns of the Archdiocese of San Francisco, and the San Francisco GAA.

Jarlath was the living embodiment of the Irish American dream. He was a singer, a storyteller, and the hardest working man you ever met. He shared his good fortune with people all over Ireland and the Bay Area. There won't be another one like him.

Jarlath is preceded in death by his wife Iris, his son Stephen, his father and mother Anthony and Mary, sisters Eileen, Kathleen, and Julia, brothers Patrick, Michael, James, Tony, and Sean. He is survived by his daughter Fiona, his sons Michael and Shane, grandchildren Micaela, Aoife, Pilar, Claire, Iris, Declan, and Evelyn, and his sister Theresa.






