## April may signal the start of baseball season nationwide but pride of place this month in the community goes to the local Cooley Keegan branch of Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann (C.C.E)

Last month, the local Comhaltas branch hosted over 300 national and international visitors for a wonderful Irish culture immersive weekend over four days (April 21-24) as part of the 2022 North American Comhaltas Convention.

Although C.C.E. is headquartered in Dublin, Ireland, there are more than 400 branches worldwide, in the Republic of Ireland, the United Kingdom, throughout the United States of America, Canada, Mexico, France, Spain, Germany, Hungary, Luxembourg, Russia, Australia and

New Zealand. It is the largest non-profit organization involved in the preservation and promotion of Irish traditional music, song, dance and storytelling worldwide.

**2022** CONVENTION — Postponed in 2020, and delayed in 2021 due to the global pandemic, the host committee were able to finally execute on plans developed well over three years ago by hosting this year's event. Co-chaired by Josephine Brennan and Joannie O'Leary, the event was a huge success held across the spacious surroundings at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Foster City.

Having had plenty of personal experience in running and hosting one day events at the UICC (concerts, shows, classes), I can only imagine the amount of human energy that went into making this "continuous and always on" four day event a success. I enquired to Comhaltas volunteer and attendee Dan McAuliffe about the source of the wooden dance floor for the Céilí dances. He answered, "all the way from Florida, shipped especially for the event". Wow, I thought, enough said. These organizers left no stone unturned for the dancers.

As I wandered around the hotel during my visit to the convention over the weekend - the sounds of Irish music was emanating from all corners of the hotel- hallways, foyer, hospitality suites, workshop and Céilí rooms. My mind wandered off to thinking that down the road when the new Irish Center is built that such a convention could easily be held in the new facility. We certainly will have the space and rooms to make that accommodate a Comhaltas convention.

The Irish Center made information available about our 2025 Project building to the convention attendees during the weekend and many expressed excitement at the possibility of such a facility on the west coast.

COMHALTAS IN IRELAND — I spoke at length with National PRO for Comhaltas in Ireland, Pat Flanagan, about all the various efforts undertaken by Comhaltas (celebrating 70 years in 2022) in the promotion of Irish culture all across the Emerald Isle. He said "It is an ongoing effort by an army of people who help organize an incredible array of events during the year for example: 1500 music classes in every county in Ireland each week for adults and kids, maintains a music competition framework leading to the All-Ireland Fleadh Cheoil finals and also helps produce and promote 44 Fleadhanna Ceoil (cultural festivals) throughout the year". Flanagan continued "All this helps maintain the success of the wonderful rich musical heritage and traditions in Ireland. That heritage is a proud resource that belongs to Irish people everywhere, young and old alike."

Although we went to the same National School in the village of Broadford, Pat lived in the neighboring parish of Feohanagh, and so he did not play Gaelic games with the blood and bandage (red and white) colors of Broadford as a youngster. Pat's brother Johnny Flanagan was a dominant figure in the Limerick hurling teams of the 1980s. There are strict rules around parish boundaries in rural Ireland when it comes to Gaelic games, and players that once may have played on school teams together could be arch enemies in the west Limerick championships when they played opposite each other for their parish clubs. Sometimes a recipe for skin and hair flying during a game along with teak tough defending! It was great to connect with Pat over the weekend and catch up about all the characters we knew from our (áit dúchais) native place.

BOXING NITE SUCCESS — The Center and Fire in the Ring boxing Gym in Brisbane teamed up for a wonderful evening to showcase amateur boxing on April 16th. Thanks to Jimmy Ford and his team for a great night for the community.


MUSIC CLASSES — Music, drama, and singing classes for kids are back in action after the Easter break. It's never too late to sign up.





Postponed in 2020, delayed in 2021, and eventually held over four days last month (April 21-24)-the 2022 North American Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann Convention was a huge cultural success. Hats off to the local hosts - the Cooley-Keegan branch of Comhaltas, spearheaded by co-chairs Josephine Brennan and Joannie O'Leary. It must not have been easy to keep her convention planning committee engaged for well over 3 years, since 2019, but they executed a wonderful program over the four days. I was fortunate to attend two of those days.

Over 300 attendees traveled from Ireland, England, Canada and from all across the US including a large contingent from New York, Boston, Chicago, Detroit, Atlanta, New Mexico and New Jersey.

Four energetic ceili's featuring the John Whelan, Pearl River (NY), Sourdough and Golden Gate Céilí bands kept the set dancers going until well after the expected end time!

A full line up of workshops some featuring local artists included singing (Vince Keehan), Irish language (Imelda White), concertina (Autumn Rhodes), recitation and storytelling (Mícheál Minihane), banjo, fiddle (Darcy Noonan), uilleann pipes (Tim Hill), sean-nós and set dancing, bodhrán (Cormac Gannon).

# BAY AREA IRISH DANCE COMMUNITY SHINES ON WORLD STAGE



Our Bay Area Irish dance community was well represented at the recent Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne (World Irish Dance Championships) sponsored by An Coimisiún Le Rincí Gaelacha (CLRG) and held in Belfast during Holy Week. This year's competition was particularly significant given there had been a two-year postponement due to the pandemic coupled with the fact that the prestigious feis was marking its 50th Anniversary.


Founded in 1927, CLRG is the oldest and largest governing body for competitive Irish step dancing globally and is responsible for creating a standardized system of Irish dance, music, and competition—including the Worlds— for its member organizations in 26 countries. The first World Championship was held in 1970 in Dublin, Ireland, and dozens of San Francisco Bay Area competitors have earned the chance to compete on the world stage over the years.

The road to a World Championship Irish Dance competition is paved with plenty



The primary qualifying event for Bay Area dancers is the Western Regional Oireachtas held each November and hosted in one of the seven Western states that make up the region. In November 2022 this event will take place in San Francisco.

It is a huge accomplishment to be a World qualifier and earn a place on the world stage, and it could be said that 2022 had an added level of challenge in terms of coming off a pandemic—a time when competitions halted, classes and training were conducted on Zoom or totally solo, and the pool of qualifiers swelled to include those who would have competed in 2020 as well as qualifiers from over the past year. This year's group of competitors no doubt over came challenges not ever seen in the 50-year history of the event. Once there, dancers must rise through three rounds over two days of competitions to be a contender for the podium. Through this double recall approach which was introduced in 2019, dancers truly are competing against the best dancers from around the world!



year's competition. Imagine judging the best of the best! For Patricia it was "an honor and a privilege to have such an amazing experience and witness the Worlds from the best seat in the house." As a longtime dancer and teacher in California, Patricia found it affirming to see the Bay Area so

well represented. Part of an esteemed group of adjudicators and the only one representing the Western Region, Patricia judged through the full eight days of competitions and shared that "the memories and experiences she gained will stay in her heart forever."

Earning the highest ranking from among the Bay Area pool of dancers and bringing home the coveted globe trophy is Hannah Logar who finished 5th place in the world. A dancer with the Whelan Academy of Irish Dance,

who also had the joy of cheering on James McLoughlin on the big stage, Hannah is the epitome of hard work and dedication and teachers Sharon Whelan MacSweeney, ADCRG and Sheila Whelan Gallagher, TCRG could not be prouder!

Michael Dillon, ADCRG of the Michael Dillon School and who teaches at the UICC was thrilled to have three competitors this year. He said "Caelan Lynch, Gina McGhee, and Brigette Petersen all had a ball and came home with a new work ethic." According to Michael, Brigette has had her most successful year to date all while juggling her studies which landed her a job with NASA and attending all her dance classes primarily through Zoom. How about that—a world class dancer and a rocket scientist!



Noreen Boyle Heavey, TCRG, a former World competitor herself who danced for the Healy School and now operates the Boyle Academy of Irish Dance with her sister Mary Ann Boyle Folan, TCRG, commented about the sheer happiness of being back and connecting with friends that she hadn't seen in person in two years or longer. Reflecting on all her years of involvement as a dancer, a dance mom, and as a teacher, she said what really struck her this year was the fact that Irish dancing has truly become global. "There were winners from Mexico, and for the first time ever a team from South Africa won the figure dance choreography. That really is amazing and a testament to the years of dedication of the teachers that came before us. From long-time Worlds announcer Dan Armstrong who himself won the first senior men's championship to those who have sown Irish dance roots elsewhere and have been able to bring such a vibrant part of Irish culture to other countries. It's wonderful." Both Noreen and Mary Ann were able to attend this year and cheer on their star dancer Claire Donohue.





# CALLUM WALSH UNDEFEATED PROFESSIONAL BOXER 6-TIME IRISH NATIONAL CHAMPION EUROPEAN GOLD MEDALIST

#### SUMMER BOXING AT THE CENTER

This summer we hope to host Cork City native Callum Walsh, a professional boxer at the Junior middleweight division (2-0), currently residing and training with Freddie Roach (Wild Card Boxing Club) in Riverside, CA. Freddie Roach is the former coach of eight-division world champion Manny Pacquiao, along with a host of other well known boxing pros including Julio César Chávez Jr., Miguel Cotto and James Toney.






