BOARD MESSAGE

NEW YEAR WITH NEW GOALS AND ASPIRATIONS FOR 2023

As we turn the corner into another new year, the Irish Center will mark forty eight years as the hub of all things Irish in the community. During the past five decades since the Center opened on March 8th, 1975, many wonderful events and gatherings have taken place here. We are fortunate to have the Center as a resource for the community. The longevity of the Center has been made possible by supporters in the community, and this has been very evident in the past few years as the Center encountered some economic headwinds. The future is much more positive now, as we exit the Covid era and look forward to writing the next chapter in the Irish Center history. 2023 will be a significant year for the 2025 Project as we move into the next phase of the redevelopment process. Watch this space!

We rounded out December at the Center, on a high note across all sections of our operations. While our event staff were kept busy with many holiday and community events, philanthropy dominated the last month of the year with a tremendous response to our 2025 Project pledges, annual appeal, Leo T. Walsh scholarship and library fundraisers. This year's appeal campaign focused on continuing to expand our Irish culture and programming footprint in 2023 with proposed expansions in library offerings, theatre, summer camp, and Irish music classes for kids.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2023 — We can look forward with renewed optimism for a full year of uninterrupted activity at the Center. It's been a number of years since we have been able to do that. The SF Rose committee will select a San Francisco rose for the International Rose of Tralee competition on January 28th. The 2023 Grand Marshals Dinner (honoring San Bruno resident Pat Uniacke) will take place on February 26th. A jampacked St. Patricks season will see full houses at the Center on the parade day March 11th and the annual Block party on March 12th. The following weekend will be epic as March 17th falls on a Friday. One of the biggest boxing nights of the year takes place the following day on March 18th in association with Fire in the Ring boxing club. Should be a great first quarter of the year.

2025 Project. — Many thanks to all those members who funded their second pledge towards the 2025 Project, and to our new first time donors who stepped up to support the dream for a new building. The 2025 Project is moving along nicely and the building group team is chipping away each week on various tasks. The bi-weekly meetings with the planning Dept. continue to drive the project forward. We anticipate being before the planning commission sometime by early summer.

New D4 Supervisor — There has been a change in the local neighborhood political landscape since the November elections. Joel Engardio won the District 4 supervisors race against incumbent Gordon Mar. Joel will now be the supporting voice for the 2025 project at city hall and we look forward to working with him to get the new building in place. Joel is hosting his District 4 community celebration here at the Center on Saturday January 7th. In recent communication with Joel, he mentioned that he would like to have his re-election party in the new building in 2026! I told him we would do everything in our power to honor that request!

The Center is pleased to announce the recent hiring of Emma Hanley and Aidan Stone as Directors of Cultural Programming, Education and Community Outreach. The positions aim to continue our promotion of Irish arts and cultural programming which is set to expand its footprint at the Center in the coming year. Now that we are on solid financial ground we can devote more attention and energy to our core mission as a non-profit. Several new initiatives and programs are coming online next spring, including theatre productions (local, national and international productions), music sessions, kids music lessons, and additional kids activities centering around education and movie nights. Funding from the Irish government through the Emigrant Support Program has allowed the Irish Center to fund these positions.

EMMA HANLEY



Emma Frances Hanley was raised in San Francisco and is lucky enough to have parents and siblings still in the city (even a brother across the street). Emma worked for 5 years in the arts in New York City, at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, Christie's auction house and at Jack Hanley Gallery (her father's gallery). In 2017, she returned to the Bay Area for a masters and began working at Amazon on Whole Foods grocery delivery after graduation. This month, Emma is starting a new product marketing job at a new company called Lumafield. She holds a B.A. in History of Art from University of California, Berkeley and an M.B.A. from Stanford University.

THE BONANZA KING TALK



WILLIAM SHAW
DECEMBER 15, 1943 - NOVEMBER 17, 2022

William Thomas Shaw of Kelseyville, CA and Manchester, NH passed away peacefully November 17, 2022 in Manchester after a brief illness. William was born December 15, 1943 in Belfast, Northern Ireland, the second child of William and Isabella Shaw. After marrying his wife Elaine in 1968, they immigrated to San Francisco, eventually moving to Marin. My Journey to the 'Mary from Dungloe'

On August 2I, 2020 (feast day of Our Lady of Knock) I met my sweetheart Dylan Murray - who is a well known magician in Ireland. As we corresponded and got to know one another sparks ignited and we became a couple. Dylan has been very supportive since the beginning and always has been there telling me that his family has adopted me as their own as well such as helping me buy my dress for the MFD.

I felt a sense of accomplishment that I made it into this year's St. Patrick's parade introducing the "Mary From Dungloe". Thank you to the United Irish Societies for letting me have a spot in the parade and to Suzanne and Rich O'Toole for lending their vintage mustang with my MFD banner on their car. I also want to thank the Irish Herald for media coverage. Sponsorship came from the Bridge Inn in Dungloe and they have been my cheerleaders.

Last July I flew back to Donegal, Ireland and I took part in the 'Mary from Dungloe' festival. It was a weeklong festival of numerous events. I am honored and privileged to be the very first San Francisco Mary of the 'Mary from Dungloe' festival and my job was to represent San Francisco and the Irish Community while I was on this journey. It was an honor to meet dignitaries such as Pat 'the Cope' Gallagher and entertainers such as Daniel O'Donnell. I saw lots of different sights around Donegal and I am proud to say that I have Donegal in my blood. One day at a soccer field I wore my San Francisco Glens soccer jersey to represent my grandfather, Neil Hagan, in his homeland. I also got to show off my teddy bear making skills.
