As I observe the bustling activity at the Center throughout November - filled with celebrations, diverse classes, and engaging events - it strikes me how rich our offerings have become. Amidst all this, what truly ignites my enthusiasm are the programs involving children. We now host STEM classes after school three times a week, provide education in Irish music and dance, and have introduced a Kids' Reading Hour at the Library, drawing a thriving crowd each week. Our annual summer camp welcomed 75 kids last June, and throughout the year, we've showcased numerous Irish dancers from the community as part of our cultural programming.

Though those cherished moments remain as memories for the time being, we eagerly anticipate a future where we can once again welcome entire families within a few years, following the Center's reconstruction. Investing in and embracing children within the Irish Center is critical; they embody our future stewards, board members, musicians, dancers, and supporters. Their presence today ensures the enduring vibrancy of our legacy tomorrow.

Today's Juveniles to Tomorrow's Seniors — Recognizing that today's juveniles are the seniors of tomorrow is fundamental for securing the Center's long-term sustainability. Actively engaging and investing in the younger generation fosters a community that not only thrives presently, but also lays the foundation for a dedicated, knowledgeable, and supportive senior community in the future. Their involvement today shapes these youngsters into the pillars that will uphold the continued success and sustainability of the Irish Center for generations ahead.

Talented Youth —This year has marked remarkable progress in our music program, particularly with the influx of talented youngsters embracing the tin whistle and fiddle through our youth music initiative. 





The Rebel Cork Benevolent Association celebrates I40 years in 2023 while the Rebel Cork Ladies Association celebrates I10 years since its establishment in I923. The annual Cork dinner has been a fixture at the Irish Center since opening in I975. The first dinner dance held at the "new" Irish Center in I975 was the Rebel Cork Ladies Dinner on October 4, I975. The only time the dinner did not take place was in 2020 due to public health restrictions around large gatherings imposed by the city of San Francisco.

Christy was born on August 26th, I960 in the front room of #2 'The Green', Ballyphehane to Christy and Maura O'Connell. Christy was the younger sibling to his late and dearly missed sister, Antoinette. His father, Christy, was the Sacristan of Ballyphehane Church.


Four months after Christy was born, his dad passed away so him and the rest of his family moved to 'The Lough' to live with his grandparents, Jack and Hannah. The house was full of music and sport. Notably, Christy's uncle, Mick Keating, played a huge part in his childhood, guiding him along and instilling a love for all things GAA.

Christy attended Greenmount NS and moved on to Cork City Technical School. He left school at the young age of 14 and began his apprenticeship as a baker. Christy spent his spare time playing guitar with friends in local bands, ultimately leading to a lifetime of music. Christy was lucky enough to tour the length and breadth of Ireland, England, and all over Europe.

Christy moved to London in 1983. In 1985, his son, Christopher, was born. Christy then made the trek to New York City in 1988 and 5 years later, traveled over to San Francisco where he met his wife, Dympna. They got married back in Ireland in 2001 and are now proud parents to Hannah and Molly.

Christy got involved in the San Francisco Irish community the minute he touched down. He had the good fortune of working with Ranger Pipelines for many years and now works with SF Park and Rec. Upon his arrival in San Francisco, Christy became a familiar presence at local Irish venues, bringing his songs and craic to his gigs no matter how big or small. His level of involvement grew significantly once his daughters started getting involved in the GAA. After being told at a tournament over 10 years ago to help carry a bag of hurls onto the pitch and give the girls a few pointers, he has yet to leave the sidelines. Coaching was one of the best decisions he made here, as it got him further involved in the incredible SFGAA community. To Christy, there is no better way to spend a Sunday than watching the games out on Treasure Island.

Christy and his family feel truly blessed to be a part of San Francisco and its vibrant Irish community. He is very honored to be chosen as Cork Man of the Year, and according to Christy, "You can't get better than that, boy."





## KEEPERS OF THE STEPS TAP INTO THE IRISH TRADITIONAL MUSIC ARCHIVES IN DUBLIN

As many know by now, Keepers of the Steps is the UICC special cultural program begun in 2020 that collects and shares the history of Irish step dancing in the San Francisco Bay Area. Committee members are actively planning another exhibition in 2024 and have begun research on some new aspects of the history they have been gathering - and this time their research is taking them to Dublin, Ireland!

Keepers committee lead, Eileen Mize has long been following an international authority on Irish Dance - historian Dr. John Cullinane who is also a longtime teacher and adjudicator (who also happened to be on the judging panel at the first Western Regional Oireachtas in San Francisco held in 1974). Eileen has a collection of Dr. Cullinane's various books on different aspects of his research, and they were of great help to her when curating the first Keepers of the Steps exhibition at the UICC in 2021.

By following the Irish Traditional Music Archive (ITMA) located in Dublin, Ireland on social media, Eileen was alerted to a very interesting acquisition in 2021. Dr. Cullinane donated his decades-old collection of research and historical facts and articles on Irish Dance to An Coimisiún le Rincí Gaelacha (CLRG) who then in turn entrusted it to the ITMA in a special arrangement where the items will be preserved, organized, and made available on behalf of CLRG. Eileen enjoyed following the ensuing weeks and months of reports on cataloging the collection, often thinking how similar the meticulous efforts were to what the Keepers are doing on a localized west coast scale.

Energized by increased global efforts to preserve and document the history of Irish step dancing, and anticipating a planned trip to Ireland with her sister, Eileen reached out to Maeve Gebruers, ITMA head archivist, to inquire about the possibility of taking a look at the collection while she was in town in late November - and plans were made! The Cullinane Archive Collection is an extensive multimedia collection of material relating to the history of Irish dance compiled by Dr. John Cullinane over his lifetime - and the native Corkman is now in his 80s!

Eileen spent several hours on November 20, 2023 in the Merrion Square archive room of ITMA and was amazed and inspired by the amount and breadth of content. She was particularly looking at items related to the western expansion of the CLRG and the emergence of Irish dance in the west with notable names such as Maureen McTeggart Hall and the Healy School. "It was fun to see important pieces of our San Francisco story carefully cataloged in the Dublin archive, and exciting to think how our Keepers of the Steps program at the UICC can play a part in this global effort," shared Eileen.

We look forward to sharing exhibition and other programming dates regarding Keepers of the Steps in the new year and look forward to seeing the unfolding of our rich history of Irish Dance. 
